Ray Moreton – All Black 1962, 1964 – 1965, Number 629:

We record with sadness the passing of R.C. (Ray) Moreton during July of this year. Old Maroons Peter Hutchinson and Tom Moynihan attended Ray's funeral in Auckland on 25^{th} July.

Born on 30 January 1942 in Dunedin, Ray was a quick and powerful midfield back who made his All Blacks debut in 1962 in Australia. He played 12 matches for the All Blacks, including seven Tests and scored 24 points.



"It is with sadness that we acknowledge the passing of Ray Moreton," said New Zealand Rugby Chairman Brent Impey. "Ray will be fondly remembered around New Zealand, in particular the Southland rugby community from which he originated and the Canterbury and Universities communities that he represented with pride. Ray made a significant contribution to rugby as a player and coach. Our thoughts are with his family and friends at this sad time."

In 1962 Moreton had also made his debut for New Zealand Universities, earning selection again in 1964 and 1965. Following his retirement from playing, he coached at the University Club in Christchurch and was a South Island Universities selector in the mid-1970s, before moving to Auckland.

Moreton received his All Blacks cap in 2009, when New Zealand Rugby retrospectively presented caps to All Blacks who had made their Test debuts between 1946 and 1996.
